### Young Enterprise win award at the Central London final

Following the successful first round and being named Central South London champions, our YE team took part in the Central London Final at Euroclear in Cannon Street. For a few of the students, it was their first experience of city offices and it didn't take them long to settle in. They had submitted a 10 page report prior to the final and then faced a gruelling 15 minute interview with the esteemed judges. Their 4 minute presentation in front of the judges, their fellow competitors and other guests was exemplary and whilst there is no prize for best presentation, it was clear who won that one. In the end, the students won the Marketing Award while Emanuel school walked off with the main prize for their sustainable jewellery. The team were gracious in their defeat especially as they had beaten Emanuel in the previous round. Undeterred, the students set up a stall at Camden Market in half-term and made lots of money selling their product "the cell phone".



### VESPA Awards 2022

The end of year VESPA awards took place on 29 June. There was a fantastic turnout by students and staff. These are awards for students that have demonstrated extraordinary commitment to one or more of the five VESPA elements: vision; effort; systems; practice; attitude. Two students, Zara Acheampong and Harry Asmah were nominated to receive the Principal's Award for their application of all five VESPA strands. Congratulations to all award winners.



## SFX win a national award at the Sixth Form Colleges Association annual awards

The College was one of just eight winners at this year's national sixth form college association awards, winning the award for Community Impact. The award recognises the work our students and staff have done with the African Caribbean Leukemia Trust

There is a major shortage of African and Caribbean donors and as St. Francis Xavier Sixth Form College has a very high student population of African and Caribbean heritage, the ACLT were invited into the College to run a stem cell, blood and organ donation awareness and registration drive.

The work of the ACLT was discussed during tutorial sessions and four ACLT staff members visited lessons over four days in March to raise awareness of the lack of donors from African and Caribbean communities. ACLT later provided opportunities for students and staff to sign up and register to become stem cell, blood and organ donors. In response to the visit ACLT received:

- 102 new potential stem cell donors
- 46 signed up to donate blood
- 17 new organ donor registrations



## UAL performance and production arts

The Yr 13 UAL performance and production arts students finally had an opportunity to perform their production of 'Tomorrow belongs to me', a spin-off of the musical 'Cabaret' in front of a sell-out audience. It was a flawless performance by the whole cast, and it was a real pleasure to see the culmination of this group's two years' of hard work. Many of this talented bunch will be progressing onto related courses at university and I'm sure this will not be the last we see of them. Meanwhile, the Yr12 students were equally impressive performing their end of year shows; two adaptations of Shakespeare's plays. Both plays had a bit of everything: acting; singing, dance and comedy. There were some very talented performers on show and what was even more remarkable is that the students devised the entire shows themselves, from the script to the lyrics down to the choreography.



## Careers Week

Over the past two weeks, Yr 12 students have participated in "Careers week", a week-long focus on their future progression opportunities. Activities have included: visiting speakers from universities, employers and former students; workshops on writing personal statements and using our careers platform, Unifrog to research universities and other opportunities such as apprenticeships. Many of the guest speakers have been Alumni of SFX such as Emma Ameral who gave a talk to travel and tourism students about her journey to becoming a member of cabin crew for EasyJet.



## House Days

To celebrate the end of the term we recently held our final House Days of the year. There was a broad range of activities taking place including guest speakers, Chaplaincy activities, study skills and sports.

## Diocesan Good Samaritan Mass

Earlier this term, some students along with the College Chaplains, attended the Diocesan Good Samaritan Mass. The Mass was held at St George's Cathedral and is open to all schools in the diocese.

In attending, students were able to support the Catholic Children's Society, who do sterling work in supporting families in need.

After the Mass our students visited the shrine of St Oscar Romero whose memorial crosses we have throughout the college and they had their photograph taken with Bishop Paul Hendricks, who is the area bishop for South West London.



## REAch Pathway

Our year 12 REAch 'Russell Group' students have begun working on their university research and preparation for their UCAS applications. They have had virtual speakers in their lessons including sessions with Oxford and Cambridge universities and an interactive session on personal statements with Kingston university. For the rest of the Summer term the programme of specialist speakers will continue with sessions scheduled with Imperial College London, King's College London and St George's university

## T Level Progress

We are ramping up our preparations for the delivery of the Management and Administration T Level, ahead of its launch this September. The new business hub, a state of the art facility which will be the home of our T level delivery, is progressing very well and on schedule to be completed during the summer holidays. It is our intention to further extend our offer of T levels in 2023 to include two new T levels: Education and Childcare; and Accounting.

A significant element of the new T level qualification is the requirement for students to undertake an extended work placement of at least 315 hours. We are in the process of building our connections and partnerships with employers to support these placements and would welcome any opportunities that parents or their employers could offer.
